Business updates

As an incentive to businesses that pay the London living wage – currently £9.40 an hour – Ealing council is intending to offer a one-off business rate discount (equivalent to two years of Living Wage Accreditation fees) for the first 100 businesses to come forward. The cost of being accredited varies depending on the size of the workforce and the type of organisation, but the maximum discount could be up to £2,000 per business.

Smart Business Grants is an Ealing council funded business support programme offering grant funding and advice to businesses that are keen to become more efficient, reduce their costs and environmental impact.

To be eligible, your business must qualify as an SME:

- Less than 250 employees.
- Less that €50 million annual turnover and/or €43 million annual balance sheet.
- Has not exceeded state aid limit (€200,000) in the past three financial years.

Available support:

- Resource efficiency survey covering energy, water, waste and raw materials consumption and report of savings opportunities.
- Capital grant (up to 50% of project cost with a minimum grant award of up to £1k up to a maximum of £5k).
